PROGRAMS AND SERVICES: **Meal Programs**

- Meals on Wheels: Provides seniors with nutritious daily meals, warm conversation and a safety check.
- **Neighborhood Lunch with Transportation:** Nutritious meals and activities in a social setting.
- **Community Food Pantry:** Open the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month at the Seniors First office.

In-Home Care Program

- **Care Management:** A custom care plan from a case manager who regularly monitors client needs.
- Personal Care: Homebound clients receive general hygiene services like bathing, shaving and dressing.
- **Homemaker:** Provides light housekeeping and services like laundry, shopping and meal preparation.
- **Companionship:** Relieves loneliness providing conversation, help with reading, errands and shopping.
- **Respite Care:** Certified personal care worker relieves caregivers for a few hours at a time.

Stepping Stone Medical Equipment Bank

Offers new and refurbished medical equipment and safety devices at little-to-no cost.

Guardianship Program

Trained staff and attorneys manage legal and medical affairs of incapacitated adults legally declared unable to care for themselves.

DID YOU KNOW?

- 1 in 6 seniors struggles with hunger. \$280 feeds a hungry senior for a month on Meals on Wheels.
- The majority of our community's seniors are lonely. \$125 provides a month of social activities and meals at our Neighborhood Lunch Program.
- 68% of seniors age 65+ live with at least one disability. \$100 removes barriers to mobility with medical equipment from our Stepping Stone Medical Equipment Bank.
- 16,000 seniors in Orange County may not know where their next meal will come from. \$100 feeds 6 hungry people for a week from our community food pantry.
- Up to 80% of seniors are socially isolated. \$50 provides 3 hours of companionship and personal care through our In-Home Care Program.
